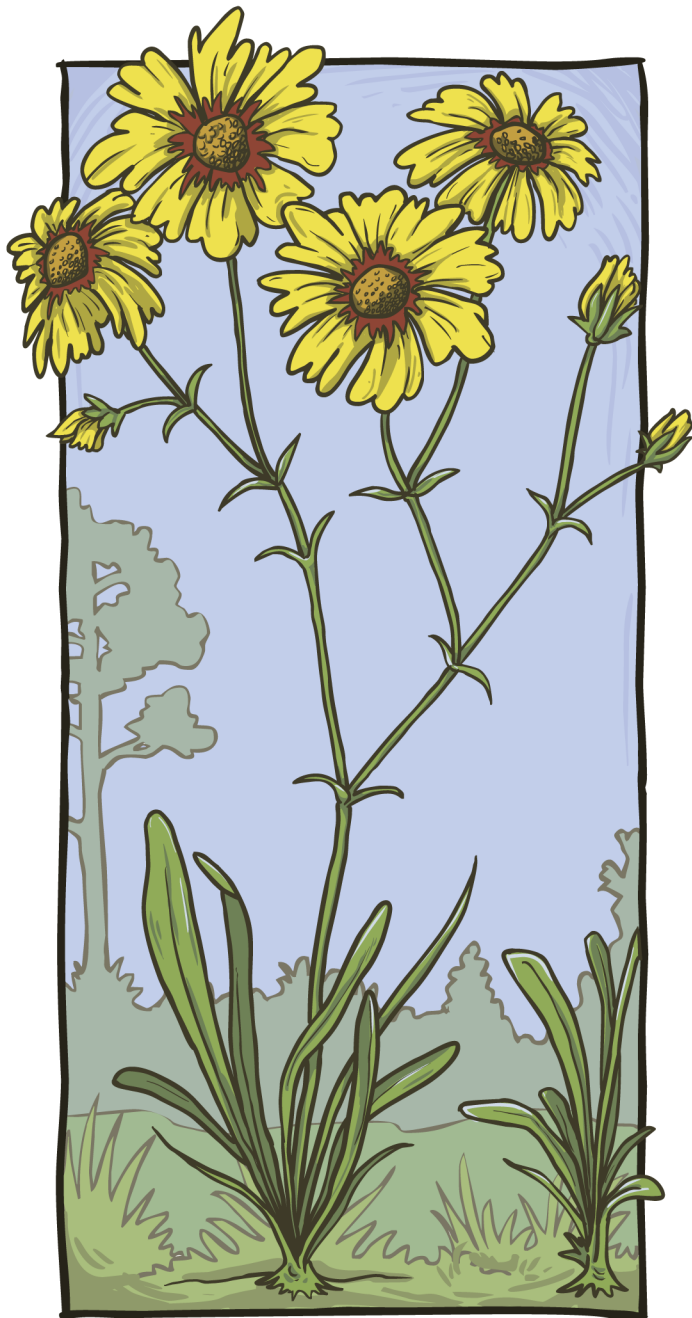


Coreopsis

Coreopsis

Instant ID

- A small, yellow, daisy-like flower
- Stems reach up to 3 feet high
- Blooms from March-August
- Leaves are clustered at ground

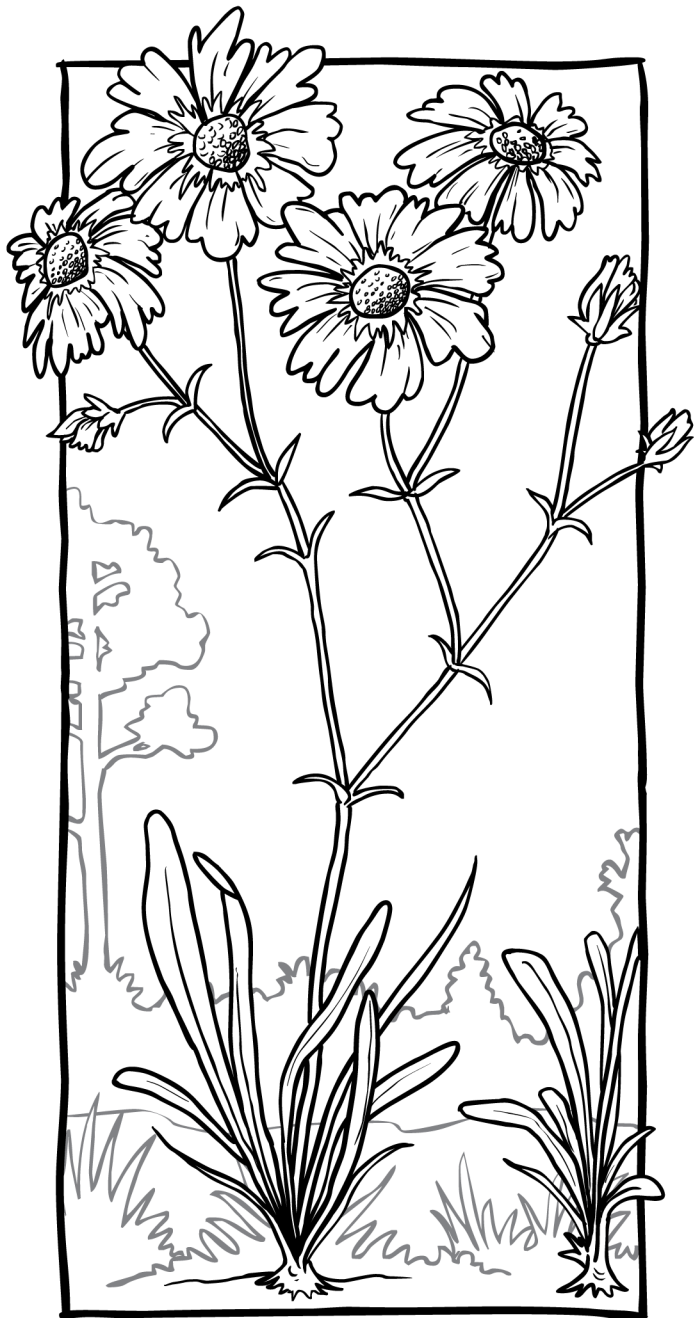
Native Niches

- Grows in grassy areas with full sun
- 13 native varieties of coreopsis grow in Florida habitats with enough sun and open ground for them to take hold
- 2 species are endemic to (found only in) Florida

Plant Particulars

- Coreopsis, also known as tickseed, is Florida's state wildflower
- Takes its common name from the two spines on its seeds, which give them a bug like appearance
- One of the key flowers in Florida's Roadside Right-of-Ways Wildflower Program

Population Protection

- Great for road shoulders because they do not require fertilizer or watering and provide excellent erosion control
- Ideal for gardeners who like maximum beauty with minimum effort
